PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1994

I have enjoyed working as President and Executive Council member in 1994 and from the Council Chairman's report you will see New Zealand Squash has had a very busy year in carrying out its various programmes and activities.

The major enphasis this year has been on the finalisation of a New Zealand Squash marketing strategy for approval by our membership. Falling membership, cancellation of the NZ Open, National Squash League and all that follows on from this, are major concerns which underline the current situation. In order to achieve and communicate the vision and goals of the Strategic Plan for NZ Squash 1994-2000, a Marketing Roadshow involving clubs nation wide was undertaken. Everyone who attended a Roadshow agrees we need a strong marketing strategy to ensure the healthy future of squash and at the Annual General Meeting this year I am sure formal approval to implement the plan will be given.

A highlight of the year was the New Zealand Squash hosting of the 1994 World Junior Mens Squash Championships in Christchurch. The record international entry and high standard of competitive squash was a joy to see and congratulations must go to the World Championship Committee and the Canterbury Squash Association who were responsible for the organisation.

I have also had the pleasure to attend the New Zealand Masters, Senior and Junior squash events. It is very encouraging to see in operation the willing participation of clubs and their hardworking members who ensure these events are run well. Thank you to everyone involved.

On several occasions I have been able to meet others involved in National Sports Management which expands our understanding of common problems, also the sponsors of New Zealand Squash to whom we extend thanks for their continuing support.

I have presided at three meetings of District Presidents which are again resulting in positive cooperation between Districts and providing an essential opportunity to meet with Council.

Congratulations to players, both national and international, as individuals and team members who have gained representative honours. To the many hundreds of personnel voluntarily involved in squash at National, District and Club level, a sincere thankyou for your generous input without which we cannot operate.

I also pay tribute to the team at the New Zealand Squash Office who have worked extremely hard in what has been a very challenging year. A year that has seen the retirement of Bill Murphy. New Zealand has undoubtably benefited from the skills and achievements of Bill as Chief Executive and wish him well in the future. As you are all aware an able Chief Executive is vital to an organisation like ours which relies so heavily on the volunteers.

We welcome Grant Scoones as the new Chief Executive. During the last couple of months, Grant has come to meet many of you and is looking forward, as we all are, to the challenges of 1995.

EXECUTIVE COUNCIL REPORT

Following the Marketing Survey carried out by New Zealand Squash during the 1993 year, 1994 saw the development of a detailed Marketing Plan designed to bring our sport back to the level of popularity and strength it had enjoyed in the past.

Once this plan had been developed and tested at Club level, the decision was made to present it to as many squash managers in New Zealand as possible. To that effect the Marketing Roadshow was developed and presented at numerous venues throughout the country. At these presentations the three aspects of our sport which the survey identified as being desperately in need of attention, and the Marketing Plan's approach to remedying these problems were discussed fully.

The development of Club 2000, to assist Clubs with managing and developing their facilities, and ensuring that through the leverage of all Clubs working together, all their requirements are obtained at the best prices possible, was the first aspect to be discussed and was supported by 88% of those attending the Roadshows.

86% of the attendees also supported the development of a quality magazine to be sent to all squash players and supporters in the country, to ensure that effective communication is achieved with everyone involved in our sport.

The development of Strikezone as a squash game specifically designed for television, to greatly enhance the public and media profile of our game, was supported by 90% of the Roadshow attendees. With this kind of support, the Council is confident that the following five major visions will be realised:

- To provide a vibrant readily accessible sport for all New Zealanders.
- To ensure quality facilities, service, management, communication, education and marketing programmes.
- 3. To create active participation at all levels.
- 4. To secure top international performance.
- To become New Zealand's most popular racquet leisure sport.

The Council met seven times during the year.
On two occasions, these meetings involved all
District Presidents, and a working party met to
consider the best way to deliver all programmes
around the Districts.

After almost three years under the present management structure, the Council is confident that we now have a better method of managing our sport but will spend some time in the coming year assessing, and if necessary, redefining its role.

The time involvement for Council members has again been considerable and with the prospect of a further period of ongoing change, the commitment of all involved in the management of our sport will be necessary for some time yet to come.

Fundraising and Sponsorship

New Zealand Squash has only been able to carry out all its programmes and development plans because of the continuing support of our major sponsors, and for this we are extremely grateful.

The Hillary Commission provides a large portion of the funding necessary for all our programmes, and for the future has chosen squash as one of the first sports to move to bulk funding.

They continue to be fully supportive of all our endeavours and remain our most valuable partner.

The New Zealand Sports Foundation again provided considerable funding for our High Performance Programme and elite players and their support plays a major part in New Zealand reamaining an extremely respected competitor at international level.

Dunlop Slazenger once again provided funding for New Zealand Squash, mainly in the Junior Youth area and we acknowledge the value of this.

Air New Zealand, as the official NZ Squash carrier, through favourable rates and special discounts has contributed to the economical travel costs of players and officials and we look forward to enhancing this relationship in the future.

Publicity

The media in all areas, has again greatly assisted us in our ongoing public profile battle with coverage of squash at both national and local levels, and we are most appreciative of the assistance of the media personnel. Television New Zealand is fully supportive of our endeavours to develop a version of our game that is suitable for televising and we know that the eventual results of this will be beneficial to us both and of great interest to the New Zealand public.

Acknowledgements

With the retirement of Bill Murphy as our Chief Executive in September 1994, squash lost the services of a what surely must be it's most loyal, faithful and hardworking servant.

Bill has had a long association with New Zealand Squash, both as an elected official, when he was involved with the management committee and rose to become a most effective and influential Vice President 1977-78, and as our first full time Executive Director from 1979-86, and Chief Executive since 1990.

At all times Bill's contribution has been well beyond what could possibly be expected from any employee. His vision and huge knowledge of the sport has resulted in squash being recognised by at least the major funding agencies, as the best managed sport in the country, and the respect and esteem in which he is held by those with whom he has come in contact with during his involvement, is immense.

Bill was made a Life Member of our sport in 1986 for his contributions, and his input since then has only grown. Everyone with an interest in squash owes a debt of gratitude to Bill Murphy.

Following Bill's retirement in September we welcomed new Chief Executive Grant Scoones to the organisation and I take this opportunity of wishing him every success in his new role.

Throughout the country, many people put voluntary time into squash in all programmes, and at all levels, and for this the Council is extremely grateful. At a national level, we are especially grateful to the National Directors of Junior-Youth, Masters, Refereeing and Gradings and Rankings. The various selectors, team managers, and those people who have put so much time into the High Performance Programme and New Zealand Squash Centre as Board members.

New Zealand Squash is extremely fortunate in the calibre and commitment of its paid employees, and our grateful thanks to all of these people, in particular Anne Murphy, our Administration Manager and Butch Gifford, Manager of Coaching and Development and Kevin Sheehy, Manager of the High Performance Programme.

Financial

The financial result for the 1994 year, showing a deficit of \$128,189 as against a budgeted surplus of \$3,300, whilst being of concern to the Council, is largely due to the decision to advance the promotion of our sport, or to unexpected, necessary extra expenditure. When the need for the extraordinary expenditure became apparent, some substantial cuts in budgeted expenditure were able to be made, but the need to continue with the development of squash as a sport, meant that some of our reserves were required to be used.

The most concerning event impacting on the financial result was the deficit of \$54,519 resulting from the Susan Devoy Foundation Tournament. The decision of Council to proceed with this tournament without sponsorship, and without the commitment of personnel at both District and Club level eventually proved to be wrong and showed that our communication system, both ways, leaves much to be desired. Council has learnt from this event and hopefully future fundraising for the Susan Devoy Foundation will be more successful.

The lack of substantial sponsorship for the World Junior Mens Championships, most successfully run in Christchurch in August, again proved costly, with a deficit of \$29,314 resulting against a budgeted break even. The long term benefits of New Zealand hosting this event however, cannot be measured in financial terms, and despite the deficit, the champs must be considered a success by New Zealand Squash during the year.

The urgent need for New Zealand Squash to market our sport for the future resulted in the Council, with the support of Districts, making the decision to present the Marketing "Roadshow" throughout the country. Some savings were able to be made in other areas of the marketing budget, but the net cost of this decision, which must be looked at as a long term investment, was \$64,612 and has all been expensed in this year.

The need to employ a new Chief Executive on Bill Murphy's retirement involved unbudgeted costs of \$15,612, and with the need to have an effective handover period, extra costs incurred increased this figure to almost \$20,000.

The continuing drop in profitability of the Squash Centre in Wellington is also of concern, and resulted in a difference between budgeted and actual income of \$47,000. Steps have been taken to reverse this trend and results in recent months show that although it may be some considerable time before previous high levels of return to New Zealand Squash are achieved, the financial importance to New Zealand Squash of this investment, can, and is being increased.

For the first time New Zealand Squash has attempted to forecast income and expenditure over a three year period. In preparing these forecasts, the Council has adopted the principle that surpluses must be achieved in the future so that requirements for longer term development and investment will be available. We must be aware of the urgent necessity for New Zealand Squash to invest now for the future growth of our sport.

Despite the large deficit this financial year, with continued planning for the future, and the support of our membership, the sport remains poised to retain and grow its financial base.

Membership

We are unable to publish Membership Statistics as at date of publication of this report because only 70% of Clubs had submitted returns. This is a disappointing response from some Clubs. Membership information is vital to the ongoing assessment of our sport.

From those Clubs that have supplied returns, it is apparent that the decline of membership noted in our market research has continued and a membership level of around 34,000 looks likely.

Events

Nationally 1994 was a quiet year with no sponsor being found to allow either the NZ Open or National Squash League to take place. This was a major disappointment to players, Districts and management alike and we hope that the marketing plan currently being considered by our sport will produce the market to again secure sponsorship and enable these events to continue.

Rheineck National Championships

It had been 30 years since the Henderson S.C. hosted this event and it was rewarded with some excellent competition.

In the individual event the womens final saw titleholder Philippa Beams under extreme pressure in the early stages but she managed to overcome Leilani Marsh in a gruelling five setter.

The mens final also went the distance with titleholder Paul Steel fighting back from 1-7 down in the fifth set to retain his crown over Glen Wilson.

In the Inter-District teams final Auckland regained the mens title with the womens going to Waikato on a countback.

Congratulations to all winners and to the Henderson S.C. and its sponsors on a very well run event both competitively and socially.

In 1995 we head into the deep south to Invercargill for this event.

Unisys National Club Teams Championships

Over a 20% drop in the number of teams competing since 1991 has been recorded (601 down to 526). Although this must cause a degree of concern at District level it did not reflect in the team numbers competing in their respective graded finals and we thank the host clubs for an excellent job.

National events and the gradings committee are currently reviewing the grading system with a view to leveling out the over full lower grades by moving players into the middle grades which should assist district entries in this event.

New rules for this event are currently being circulated for comment and introduction in 1995.

Cousins Shield/Mitchell Cup

The competition was hosted by the Kawaroa Park S.R.C. in New Plymouth who turned on an excellent weekend for players.

The womens teams contested an eight draw with Remuera running out the winner over Henderson.

In the Cousins Shield we saw a fifteen team competition with Remuera completing the double, also over Henderson, on the final day.

The rules regarding player eligibility have been updated to allow interclub participants to compete even if they reside out of the club's district.

Tokoroa will host the event in 1995.

Players Represenatives

Mark Gribben of Dunedin and Jenny Bell of Hamilton undertook these duties in 1994. Council thanks are extended to these reps for passing on information for the players.

One thing that they do require is more player feedback and are looking at compulsory player attendance at their annual meeting.

International

The New Zealand Mens Team again performed with distinction at the World championships in Pakistan last year, and despite problems with the seedings finished in 5th place. The team of Ross Norman, Paul Steel, Glen Wilson and Wayne Werder was a good mixture of experience and youth, with Ross Norman retaining his top ten world ranking and also winning the British Over 35 title, and the others all having some very good wins in international tournaments throughout the world.

Unfortunately the lack of international experience really counted against our Junior Mens Team at the World Championships in Christchurch, where a vast improvement in the standard of Junior mens squash since the previous event was apparent.

Meetings

No formal meeting of the Oceania Squash Federation was held during the year, but New Zealand was represented at the World Squash Federation AGM in Guernsey. Although no meeting was held with Squash Australia during the year the level of co-operation, particularly in the coaching area, remains high.

World Federation

Susie Simcock was elected unopposed to the position of Vice President of the World Squash Federation, and continues to play a major part in the works of this body.

Selectorial

For 1994 the selectors had as their brief, the

selection of the 1994 World Womens Team to compete in Guernsey, the compilations of the Senior Mens and Womens Ranking List (top 16 players) for the year, and the seeding of players for major tournaments.

In addition, all major tournaments were attended by at least one of the selectors and assistance was given in the selection of the mens training squad for 1995 in preparation for the 1995 World Mens Championships.

One of the difficulties experienced by the selectors in 1994 was in comparing players for seeding purposes. The demise of the League Competition has meant that not as many players now compete in tournaments outside their own Districts. This was unlike 1992/93 when the League competition meant that all the top players met each other regularly throughout the season.

The consequences of this is that the selectors have used the grading list this year more so than previously.

The Selectors between them have attended all but one of the Open tournaments held throughout the season plus other major tournaments such as the Cousins Shield/Mitchell Cup, the National Championships and Inter-District Teams Event.

The NZ Womens Team was selected in late July 1994. The team was the youngest womens team selected for New Zealand.

The use of computer results of individual players has also assisted the selectors for seeding and grading purposes.

Barrie Matthews voluntarily withdrew from the selection panel during the early part of 1994. Thanks are due to Barrie, his replacement Hugh Leabourn and Sandra Tinkler for the time and effort on selection matters during 1994.

Masters

There was no New Zealand/Australia test series this year due to the World Masters Games being held in Brisbane. However, all possible team members are looking forward to the 1995 series which will be held in conjunction with the Third Masters Squash Championships in Melbourne.

For the first time Waikato held district teams events, as Auckland have done for the last three years. It is hoped that other districts will introduce this competition in 1995, with the long term intention being for the event to become a National Club Championship, similar to Cousins Shield and Mitchell Cup.

South African Visit

A group of twelve male veteran squash players from Johannesburg visited New Zealand for a squash/rugby supporter's tour. They played six matches, losing only one and had an extremely enjoyable time here. There is a strong possibility of a reciprocal visit to South Africa next year.

Allkar Sales Ltd L.M.V.D New Zealand and Oceania Championships

Due to the difficulty the Oceania Squash Federation had in finding a host venue for the Oceania Masters Championships this year New Zealand agreed to run the event in conjunction with the NZ Masters Championships which was hosted by the Kamo Club, and supported by the Whangarei and Mangakahia Clubs. For the first time nine Districts competed in the Inter-District Teams events, which was won by Auckland. The event was very well run, thanks to an extremely, efficient organising committee.

The 1995 Championships will be hosted at the Hawkes Bay S.R.C. in Napier.

Junior-Youth Squash

The Junior-Youth Committee and its personnel had a particularly difficult year. The year involved some changes, as the Hi-Tec 1994 World Junior Mens Squash Championships certainly took the limelight as far as the Junior scene was concerned.

This year's Junior-Youth Committee involved no direct involvement from the Chairman Murray Withers, whose attentions were focussed on the World Junior Men's Championships. However, with Marge Forrester coming on as Convenor of the Junior Selectors and with the able assistance of Kathy Pepper, Tony Naughton and, until his resignation, Robbie Burnett, Junior matters were in very capable hands.

Once again, there were many strong administrators in various regions and those regions with strong, positive Junior Co-Ordinators had an active and vibrant Junior scene.

This year is the last year that Kathy Pepper will be Junior Director and the Association and all those involved in the Junior area pass on to Kathy our sincere thanks for her able assistance and her "hands on" approach to the Junior scene. Thanks are also extended to Robbie Burnett for his involvement in the Junior Selectorial position and also thanks to all the Junior Convenors and Junior Organisers who have put in many hours during the course of the year.

The undoubted highlight of the 1994 squash season was the hosting by New Zealand of the Hi Tec 1994 World Junior Mens Squash Championship. This event, was an outstanding success. There were many Junior administrators from throughout New Zealand in attendance throughout the event and we saw some outstanding squash. Ahmed Barada from Egypt won the individual title over his countryman Omar El Borollossy, while Egypt took the teams title. All in all a brilliant event.

The New Zealand team struggled to match its highly competitive overseas counterparts but was a credit to the New Zealand Squash scene. Also, there were many New Zealand individuals who participated and thoroughly enjoyed the event and will certainly be better for the International experience.

Oceania Age Group Championships

The Oceania Age Group Championships probably played second fiddle this year. Some Districts chose not to send Juniors to the event because of the desire to fund and send Juniors to the World Junior Mens Championship. There was, however, a good contingent from New Zealand, with a Boy and a Girls team entered from New Zealand plus several individual players.

Successful participants being Louise Crome who won the Under 17 Girls, Shelley Kitchen who won the Under 15 Girls and Lara Petera, runner up in the Under 17 Girls. Corey Love 4th in the Under 19 Boys and Shaun Madden in the Under 15 Boys. The New Zealand Girls Team also won the Teams event title and the Boys were runnersup.

National Events

This year's Junior National event was, once again, well supported and adopted a new format. With both the New Zealand Junior Open and New Zealand Age Groups being combined into one event. It seemed to be a successful move and a move that will be followed next year. Once again the Junior scene was sponsored by Slazenger and our thanks are extended to Slazenger for their continued participation in the Junior area.

The South Island Age Groups were hosted by the Sumner Club and the North Island Age Groups were held at Wanganui. The Junior Open/Age Group Championships were hosted by the Cambridge Racquets Club and involved 194 entries. This was a massive undertaking by the Club and our thanks are extended to the Club and its administrators.

Youth Championships

The Slazenger North Island and Slazenger South Island Youth Championships were held on the weekend of 25-27 March with, the North Island event being hosted at the Hastings Squash Club and the South Island event at the Ashburton Squash Club. The New Zealand Youth Championships this year were hosted by the Tokoroa Squash Club. There still appears to be a continuing demand for squash in these areas and it would seem that they will remain a focal point on the calendar.

Selectors

The role of the Junior Selectors continued to develop this year. There is a closer association with the High Performance Board and there seems to be greater communication between the Selectors and that Board. This can only advance and promote squash in the Junior area. The Junior Selectors, once again, participated fully at tournaments and participated in the Junior scene.

There seems to be a better base for identifying talent and better communication between Selectors and Districts. New Zealand Squash is very satisfied with the way the Selectors have developed their role.

New Zealand Secondary Schools Championships

The Slazenger Secondary School Championships were held this year in the Northland District. The reports received from this were very positive and it was another successful event. The eventual winners were Westlake Boys College in the boys and Kaitaia College in the girls. Secondary Schools is a continuing growth area that requires focus.

Future

The one matter that has become abundantly clear in Squash is the need to pay greater attention to Primary, Intermediate and Secondary School squash. Continued promotion in the Junior area is essential in order that we have a greater number of future adult participants.

Education, Training & Development

Kiwisquash

The Kiwisquash Programme was conducted in five districts this year and has been very successful. Most districts now realise that clubs must totally support the microcourt going to a nearby school before any real benefits from the exercise can be achieved.

We still see the need for clubs to seek and support some sort of inexpensive court being permanently established within school grounds as a top priority over the next few years.

Secondary Schools

A working party was established to produce a programme which could be used in all secondary schools. This working party decided on piloting the programme in about four or five areas and getting feedback prior to expanding the programme.

From the reports received back from participating school teachers the overall project was very successful.

We are at present looking at the whole area of Squash in Schools in association with the Regional Delivery Programme and the Susan Devoy Foundation Trustees.

Coach Development

Another successful year for coach development.

Successful Level One Courses were conducted early in the season so coaches who attend these courses could get some "practical" time in during the season to become an accredited coach.

A very successful Conference was held by the W.S.F. in Zoetermeer, Holland in May and through assistance from the Hillary Commission the Manager of Coaching and Development was able to attend. Information gathered from that Conference has been disseminated to the Level Two coaches at both the International Coaching Symposium and the Level Two Workshop that was held in October at a Junior Womens Training Camp.

A third Level Two Workshop/Course was held in

October and attended by 13 candidates.

A NZS Level Three course is still in its development and planning stages and a number of New Zealand Coaches may attend the Australian course in the interim.

Womens Development

This year New Zealand Squash conducted two workshops for Level One Women Coaches to progress to Level Two. These workshops received high praise from the attendees and will be repeated in 1995.

International Coaching Symposium

With the generous support of the Hillary Commission and Air New Zealand a symposium was conducted in Christchurch during the 1994 Junior Mens World Championships.

There were 27 nations competing in Christchurch and either the team coach or manager attended the Symposium.

New Zealand Squash owes many thanks to the presenters for their time and effort - from England Paul Wright - Australia Geoff Hunt - Jeff Wollstein - Roger Flynn - Singapore Ken Hiscoe - Switzerland Marcel Sehrantz - Malaysia Major Manium - our own New Zealanders Neven Barbour Kevin Sheehy and Butch Gifford.

Also, thanks to Susie Simcock who as the W.S.F. Vice President and representative opened the Symposium and attended all sessions.

The symposium was also attended by 14 Level Two New Zealand coaches whom received the huge benefits of just being there, and getting to know the coaches better.

From a New Zealand Squash perspective it was a huge amount of work but it gave a large number of people the opportunity to share and glean information from some of the top coaches in the World.

National Coach

There is general agreement within the NZ Squash community that the appointment of a National Coach should be a priority for 1995. Council and presidents will consider this at their meeting in December.

Refereeing

Since last years Annual General Meeting Council has adopted a Refereeing Management Plan and the document that will form the basis for the promotion and development of refereeing within NZ Squash.

The Management Plan was developed with input from the Refereeing Committee members as well as the National Accreditation Panel.

The new structure has been in place just over a year now and despite some initial teething problems is providing an effective team to implement and promote the refereeing programmes. The chairman of the National Accreditation Panel, was added to the Refereeing Committee during the year and this has certainly improved the management and communication aspects.

Chas Evans is standing down this year and has been replaced by Dave Toomey. Thanks to Chas for the many hours he has put into refereeing administration.

Thanks also to Joss Urbahn who stepped in and took over from Peter Filbee as the Director part way through the year.

Qualifications

Congratulations to Mike Irving and Russell McQuarters (Canterbury), Judy Harrison (Wellington), Richard Coxon (Central), Matthew Tana and Neville Waugh (Northland) who gained their NR2 qualification during the year.

Through the efforts of Peter Highsted a new activity form has been designed and implemented which along with the updated refereeing register should ensure a better record of refereeing activity is maintained.

Our congratulations go to Peter Highsted on obtaining his World Referee's badge. With Chas Evans, this brings our World Referees to two, while Gavin Whyte is an International Referee.

Awards

Doug Flint was awarded the Derek Cook Memorial Trophy for services to refereeing. At the North Island Championships this year he did a fine job as the tournament referee as well as playing a major part in assisting with the tournament control.

Our appreciation is extended to all the tournament referees appointed this year, and for your services and hard work, in particular Gary Hutchison and Mike Irving at the World Junior Mens Championships and to Dave Toomey, Chas Evans and Doug Flint for their efforts at the Nationals.

Resource Material

After considerable work and editing, the video is finally ready. Every Club should be encouraged to purchase a copy as it will certainly assist in teaching refereeing to all levels.

Gradings and Rankings

Grading System

The UNISYS Computer Squash Grading System continues to successfully support the competitive squash scene in New Zealand. On an annual basis, some 150,000 individual match results are entered into the system, from 650 odd tournaments, district interclub and the various teams events.

The decline in the number of graded players over the past few seasons has continued. In October, grading list numbers totalled 19,613 players (12,587 male and 7,026 female), which is a reduction of 510 players when compared with the same point last season.

Clearly the current method of determining affiliation fees is having an adverse effect on graded player numbers with Clubs continuing to "cull" the casual, competitive players in an effort to minimise affiliation fees.

In addition to the seven full grading lists produced for the season, a number of "Junior" and "Masters" lists were produced for both District and National personnel to assist them in their activites.

Ranking System

The Ranking System was again run on a pilot basis during the 1994 season. In addition to the major national and district events, a good number of club events that met the required standard were also entered into the system.

However, even after including the club events, there is still concern as to the small number of players who participated in more than two or three events that met the standard required for the event to be entered into the system. This lack of player participation in more than two or three events must be addressed if the system is to have a full practical application.

Thanks

The District Statisticians are the backbone of the grading system, and it would not be the successful system that it is without their ongoing and time consuming work.

In addition, considerable thanks must go to Charmian Hayes, the National Co-Ordinator, for her continued excellent work with both the grading and ranking systems over the past season.

High Performance Programme

The High Performance Programme has twin goals:

- * To assist outstanding young Squash players to realise their full potential and NZ to gain success in International competition.
- * To increase the levels of Coaching expertise and the numbers of highly trained coaches in NZ.

A review of the High Performance Programme has taken place and currently ways of implementing refinements to the programme are being canvassed.

Whatever is the best for most effective development of an individual talented athlete is the priority.

The need for a more structured, effective regional training and coaching programme is recognised. A more co-operative approach between coaches is required to enable athletes to progress smoothly from home base through to international status.

The establishment of four regional satellite institutes working in co-operation with the NZ Squash Institute is under consideration.

The appointment of a National Coach contracted to work with coaches and squads of identified athletes within the regions and nationally with World Championship squads, is seen as desirable. Institute scholars will continue to be identified from World Championships squads and provided with resources for international experience, coaching and sports science support.

Programme Operation

This has been led by a "team operation" of Kevin Sheehy, (Manager, High Performance Programme) and Butch Gifford, (Manager Coach Education and Training), assisted by the four Regional Coaches (Gaye Bryham, Mark Devoy, Paul McFadzien and Graeme Randolph).

Together with Neven Barbour, Norm Coe, Bryce Taylor, Rob Crothall, and a number of other coaches, specialists and people who have worked hard and enthusiastically for the benefit of the programme.

Performance Highlights

Philippa Beams

Again won the NZ National Championships and has further consolidated her international performances by improving her world ranking from 25 to 17.

Leilani Marsh

Runner up NZ National Championships. Her world ranking has improved significantly during this year from 27 to 19.

Ross Norman

Still holding a world No.8 ranking - an amazing achievement! Current British Over 35 Champion.

Paul Steel

Current NZ National Champion has made good progress in 1994 improving his world ranking from 38 to a current 18, with some excellent international results during the year.

Glen Wilson

Runner up in NZ National Championships in a closely contested final has a current world ranking of No.34. Most recently reached the third round of the World Open Championships.

Louise Crome

Won the Oceania Under 17 title in Mackay, Australia defeating fellow New Zealander Lara Petera.

Shelley Kitchen

Won the Oceania Under 15 title for the second consecutive year.

International

1994 World Junior Mens Championships -Christchurch

The NZ team (Paul Cameron, Matt Anderson, Shaun Madden and Corey Love), was prepared and supervised by Coach Manager Mark Devoy with assistance from Kevin Sheehy and others. The disappointing 14th placing reflected in part the accelerated standard of a number of emerging squash nations.

Positive benefits will arise from the fact that a dozen NZ boys competed in Christchurch who will be eligible for the World Junior Mens Championships in Egypt in 1996. Championship Squads have already been identified.

1994 World Womens Championships - Guernsey

Coach Manager Rob Crothall led the NZ Womens team to a very creditable fourth position in the World Women's Teams Championships. This was achieved by a youthful team which included Sarah Cook and Jade Wilson who just one year ago successfully led the NZ Junior Womens Team in Malaysia.

Philippa Beams and Leilani Marsh particularly impressed with their performances in Guernsey.

Oceania Championships

Mark Devoy, Gaye Bryham and Paul McFadzien took eleven High Peformance athletes within World Championships and Slazenger Squads to the Oceania Championships in Mackay, Australia. This was a developmental exercise, exposing young athletes to international experience. A total of 22 kiwis took part in the event.

The NZ Girls team (Louise Crome, Shelley Kitchen, Lara Petera and Peara Rameka) won the Oceania gold medal defeating Australia in the final whilst the boys won silver.

Australian Age Group Championships

Louise Crome and Shelley Kitchen attended with Gaye Bryham to gain further international experience at the venue of the 1995 World Junior Womens Championships in Sydney.

Gaye has been appointed Coach Manager of the team and is currently involved with squad preparation for the World event in July next year.

Sports Science

We acknowledge the continuing very special involvement of both the NZ Sports Foundation and the Hillary Commission.

NZ Squash Centre Annual Report 93/94

Despite some positive signs over the last quarter of the 93/94 trading year, the financial position of the Centre still gives cause for concern with a drop in gross revenue, mainly from Court Fees, of around \$50,000 in the past 12 months impacting severely on the net surplus at balance date (\$10,153 down from \$56,371 for 1993).

This disappointing result indicates a need for continuing high standards of management of the Centre if it is to maintain any sort of credibility as a viable trading arm of NZ Squash.

On the plus side, Centre Manager Rob Walker, who took over in March this year has put in place a number of initiatives that are already showing some return. These include:

- Court Sponsorships
- Corporate & Business House Leagues and One Off Events
- Social Leagues
- Advance Court Bookings
- Coaching Clinics
- Fun Tournaments
- Increased Pro-Shop Turnover through purchase incentives to local clubs

Also in the planning stage is research into the feasibility of converting the existing cafeteria into a licensed cafe and establishment of a NZSC Players Club for interclub status.

Rob will also turn his talents to reducing costs wherever possible.

The Council are aware that in the current squash climate, a return to the profitability levels of past years will be difficult, but are confident that with diligent management and continuing attention to the promotion and marketing of the Centre to the Wellington community, improvements will result short term, with greater medium term results creating reserves that will return the Centre to the valuable asset that it was several years ago.

The Council extends sincere thanks to 93/94 NZSC Board members John Wesney, Ian Schofer, Ray Southey, Neven Barbour and Bill Murphy for their efforts over what has been a difficult year.

AUDIT REPORT

To the Readers of the financial report of New Zealand Squash (Inc)

We have audited the financial reports as presented. The financial report provides information about the past financial performance of New Zealand Squash (Inc) and it's financial position as at 30 September 1994. This information is stated in accordance with the accounting policies as set out.

NEW ZEALAND SQUASH (INC) RESPONSIBILITIES

The Executive Council is responsible for the preparation of the financial report which fairly reflects the financial position of the Association as at 30 September 1994 and of the results of operations and cash flows for the year ended 30 September 1994.

AUDITORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

It is our responsibility to express an independent opinion on the financial report presented by the Executive Council and report our opinion to you.

BASIS OF OPINION

An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. It also includes assessing:

- * the significant estimates and judgements made by the Executive Council in the preparation of the financial report, and
- * whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Association's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards in New Zealand except where our work was limited as explained below. We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial report is free from material misstatements, whether caused by fraud or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of the information in the financial report.

Other than in our capacity as auditors we have no relationship with or interests in the association.

QUALIFIED OPINION

Control over court fee income for the New Zealand Squash Centre prior to being recorded is limited as there are no practical audit procedures to determine the effect of this limited control.

In this respect alone we have not obtained all the information and explanations that we have required.

In our opinion, except for adjustments that might have been found to be necessary had we been able to obtain sufficient evidence concerning court fee income, the financial report of the Centre fairly reflects the results of the operations and cash flows for the year ended 30 September 1994.

In our opinion the financial report fairly reflects the financial position of New Zealand Squash (Inc) as at 30 September 1994.

Our audit report was completed on 8th November and our qualified opinion is expressed as at that date.

STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. General Accounting Policies

The measurement base adopted is that of historical cost.

Reliance has been placed on the fact that the Association is a going concern. Accrual accounting is used to match expenses & revenues.

2. Consolidation

The trading result from the Centre and the operation of the High Performance Programe/Squash Institute have not been incorporated into the income and expenditure account of the Association, due to the different nature of the operations. The three balance sheets however, have been consolidated.

Stock

Stock has been valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value. Due allowance has been made for slow moving stock.

4. Depreciation

Depreciation is generally calculated at the ordinary rate approved for tax purposes (old regulations) except in the case of the New Zealand Squash Centre building and leasehold improvements where a rate of depreciation to equate the term of the current lease, due to expire in 1999, has been used.

5. Accounts Receivable

Accounts Receivable are stated at expected realisable value. Where a debt is considered to be irrecoverable it has been written off in the accounts.

6 Liabilities

Liabilities are stated at the estimated amounts payable.

New Zealand Squash Centre Valuation

An up-to-date valuation of the Squash Centre has been impossible to obtain, but the latest estimate of the reinstatement cost of the buildings for insurance purposes is \$ 2.257 million

8. Goods & Services Tax

All transactions are recorded exclusive of GST.

Accounts Receivable - Accounts within the debtors subsidiary ledger are stated inclusive of GST. Additional debtors are exclusive of GST.

Accounts Payable - are stated exclusive of GST.

9. Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no material changes in accounting policies since the previous financial year.


