## OVERVIEW

In the past, squash coaches were required to attend a block (one-size-fits-all) course and afterwards there might have not been any opportunities to develop further. It is now recognised that learning needs to be ongoing and the National Coach Development Framework allows squash coaches to learn in a range of areas that are important to them. Each of the 11 regional District Associations are responsible for developing the game of squash in their respective areas. To do this they utilise the National Coach Development Framework to fit the needs of their communities and are supported by Squash New Zealand training and resources.

A network of regional CoachForce Facilitators are now trained to travel to clubs and schools to provide the range of coach development opportunities. Since its launch there have been 1,2735 individual coaches complete a combined 3,040 coach modules. This compares with the old coach development system which would usually deliver between 50-60 development opportunities each year.

In 2016 alone there have been 12 Facilitators upskill 334 coaches (including 167 new) in 59 coach development modules.

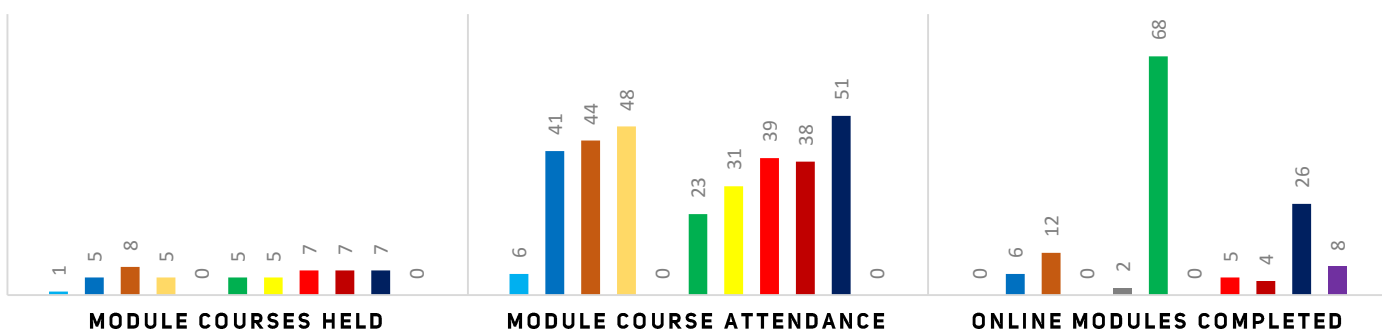


# NATIONAL COACH DEVELOPMENT FRAMEWORK NUMBERS BY DISTRICT

The affiliated squash network responsible for administering squash throughout the country is divided into 11 regions - 7 in the North Island and 4 in the South Island. Each region is managed by a regional District Association who help clubs deliver the game of squash in their area. Some have a compact region to work within and some cover a large geographical area and / or have a large number of clubs to support.

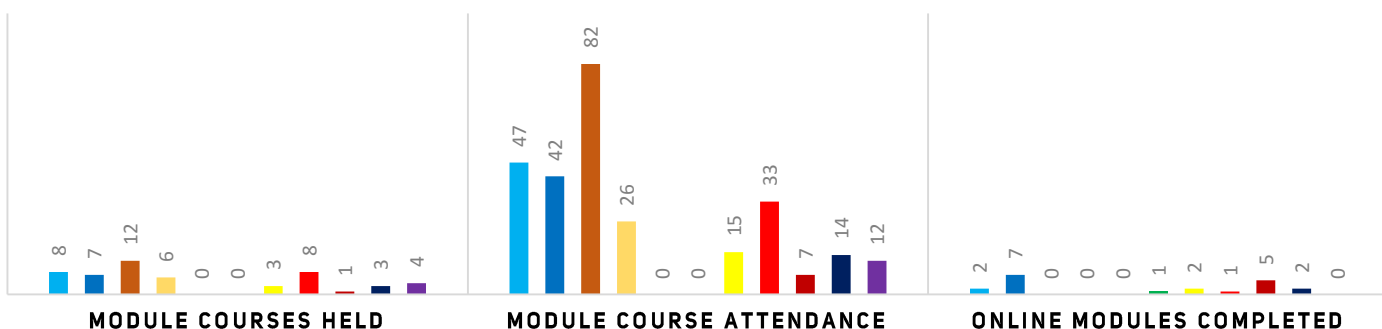
## SQUASH COACH DEVELOPMENT 2013-2014

Northland Auckland Waikato Bay of Plenty Eastern Central Wellington Canterbury Midlands Otago Southland



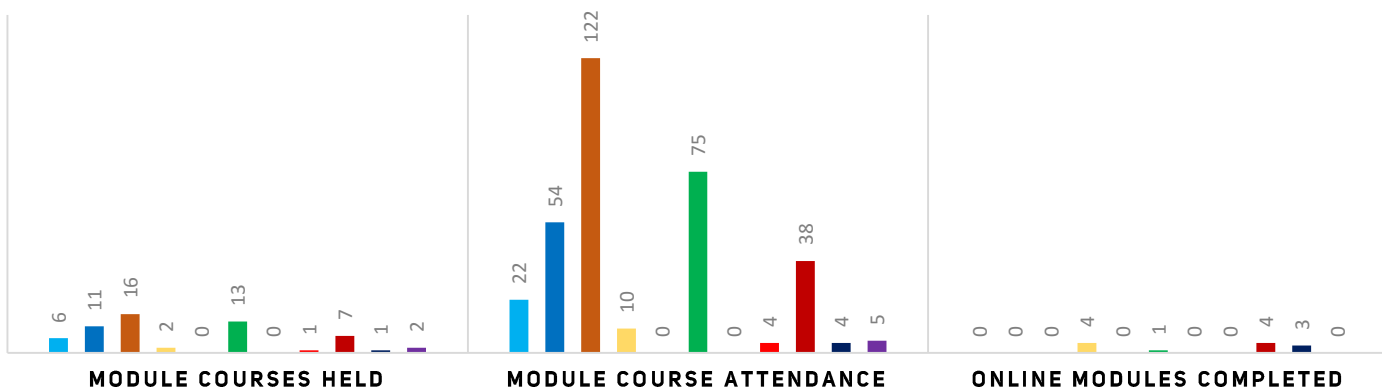
